DIRECTOR'S NOTES





Happy Women in History Month! We continue to find a great deal of joy and accomplishment as we collaborate and celebrate the evolution of *Black Girl Magic* from workshop to full production.

Black Girl Magic has this gift of impacting everyone who experiences it. Of course, the audience and cast learn about the Black girls and women we feature. Audience members also gain some insight on the perspective of Black women and girls as they navigate their way through this world. *Black Girl Magic* also gives us a moment to reflect, to introspect, to recall our own stories. It is a mirror for those of us who share the identity of Black girl/woman.

Thematically, we wanted to include elements of traditional African American storytelling in this production. Sharing the narrative voice is one of those key elements. Characters seamlessly pass along narrative responsibility and guide the audience and "Sister" through this world. Another element we've continued to include is the transfer of energy and healing through the power of touch. Notice how characters use touch to support and build-up one another. Lastly, circles appear throughout. Circles surround characters to transport them, to cover them in protection and love, and to wrap them in joy and purpose.

This year's production is also a continuation of the overarching theme of Sankofa, an African principle derived from the Akan people of Ghana. Sankofa, which means "retrieve," stresses that one should remember the past to make positive progress in the future. Allow your past to drive you forward in living a life filled with purpose on purpose. Allow your past to drive you forward in experiencing and sharing healing, light, and love that nurtures the spirit of community.
